



### What is an Erasmus Mundus Joint Master?

A high-level integrated & transnational study programme at MA level

A Master programme of excellence open to all disciplines

Delivered by an international consortium of HEIs from different countries worldwide & other partners

Offering high-level scholarships to excellent students worldwide



#### What are the requirements of an EMJM?

- a jointly designed fully integrated curriculum

- a consortium of at least three HEIs from three different countries

- international outreach to attract excellent students worldwide

- compulsory physical mobility for all enrolled students

- contribution of scholars/guest lecturers

- delivery of a joint degree or multiple degrees

At application stage EMJM proposals must present fully developed joint study programmes, ready to run and to be advertised worldwide after their selection.

#### How does an EMJM look like?

Fixed Grant Agreement of 74 months independently from the length of the master

Commitment to enrol a certain number of students per project

At least 4 master editions lasting 1 to 2 academic years (60, 90,120 ECTS)

Start of the 1st edition no later than the academic year following the year of project selection


At least 2 study periods in 2 countries (of which at least one in an EU Member State or a third country associated to the Programme and both different from country of residence of students)

Geographical balance of students: no more than 10% of total scholarships per project awarded to students of the same nationality



## Taking part as an Organisation

Minimum consortium: 3 HEI from 3 different countries of which at least 2 must be located in EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme



#### + optional

Other full academic or non-academic partners

Associated partners

- Open to any public or private organisation worldwide
- Applications can be submitted by any eligible HEI worldwide
- ✓ HEIs in EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: valid ECHE\*
- ✓ HEIs in third countries not associated to the Programme: should commit to ECHE principles in the Partnership Agreement
- ✓ HEIs from EU Member States, third countries associated to the Programme and third countries not associated to the Programme: completed accreditation/evaluation of the master programme

## Taking part as an individual

Open to students worldwide





- Applicants:
  - ✓ must hold a first higher education degree or equivalent.
  - ✓ must not have benefited previously from an EMJM scholarship




- The best ones can benefit from a scholarship depending on the number of scholarships available (Up to max. 1.400 € per month)
- Students apply directly to the EMJM consortium


#### Institutional costs

- **▶Implementation costs** of the study programme
- >unit cost per enrolled student of 750€ /month
   How to calculate: € 750 x n° of months x n° of enrolled students (cap of 100 enrolled students but consortia are welcome to commit for higher numbers)
   => max. amount per project: 1.800.000 €
- >Same unit cost for scholarship holders and non-scholarship holders
- Same unit cost for students from EU Member States, third countries associated to the Programme and third countries not associated to the Programme



#### EMJMD vs. EMJM - Institutional contribution


120 ECTS, 60 scholarship holders, 15 non-scholarship holders

## Student scholarship

#### At student level:

- > Full Scholarship to cover subsistence, installation and travel + fee waiver
- A single unit cost per scholarship holder How to calculate: € 1400 x number of months (min. 1 academic year - max. 24 months)



=> max. amount per student: 33 600 Euros

#### At project level:


How to calculate: € 1400 x number of months x number of students (cap of 60 students per EMJM project)

=> max. amount per project: 2,016,000 Euros per grant

=> Same unit cost for students from EU Member States, third countries associated to the Programme and third countries not associated to the Programme

## Individual needs NEW

#### At student level:

- Contribution based on individual needs of students:
  - 10 different unit costs varying between € 3.000 € 60.000
  - => if below € 3000: to be covered by institutional costs

#### At project level:

Awarded at **contracting stage**:

- 0, 1 or 2 units costs of € 60 000
- => max. amount per project: € 120 000
- => For all enrolled students (scholarship holders and non-scholarship holders)



## Additional funds (for students from targeted regions)

- Response to the EU External priorities
  - -> EU financial Instruments IPA III and NDICI for students from third countries not associated to the Programme
- Contribution for additional scholarships (including the corresponding institutional costs) for the entire duration of the EMJM programme: maximum amount: 3 under IPA III and 27 under NDICI for students from 9 target regions



## **Application package – EMJM**

#### The application form is structured in 3 parts

Part A - Administrative Forms

Contains general information about the project, data on the applicant organisation and contact persons

Part B – Technical description & annexes

Contains the narrative part of the project, the work packages, milestones & deliverables

Part C – Administrative forms

Specificities about the EMJM (number of ECTS, accreditation, type of degrees to be awarded, etc.)

- Complete Part A & C directly on the Portal
- Prepare Part B in advance and upload it together with the mandatory annexes (and the optional ones if applicable)



### EMJM Award criteria and Evaluation procedure

#### **EMJM Award Criteria:**

- ❖ Relevance (max. 30 points)
- Quality of the project design and implementation (max. 30 points)
- Quality of the partnership and the cooperation arrangements (max. 20 points)
- Impact (max. 20 points)

Peer review by independent external experts – 3 experts assess each proposal in a one-step evaluation procedure



#### **Erasmus Mundus Action- calls for proposal 2022**

- ✓ Publication of the Calls: 24 November 2021
- ✓ Deadline: 16 February 2022
- ✓ Expected date of selection results: **Summer 2022**
- ✓ Budget: 145M € (EMJM); 3M € (EMDM)
- ✓ Nr. of projects for EMJM: ~ 27
- ✓ Nr. of projects for **EMDM**: ~ **55**





## Main changes compared to call 2021

- ➤ New terminology:


- > Better definition of the award criteria and some clarifications in the wording
- ➤ EMJM: Duration of the Grant Agreement: **now 74 months** (instead of 6 academic years)
- ➤ EMJM: More top-up scholarships under Heading 6 per EMJM project:
  3 under IPA III and 27 under NDICI for students from 9 target regions
- **EMJM**: **Regional priorities** under NDICI funds

N° of coordinating organisations (# 70)





N° of organisations as full partner (#238)







# What is the rationale behind Erasmus Mundus Design Measure?

Encouraging the development of new, innovative, high level integrated transnational study programmes at Master level

Diversifying the offer of JM programmes and involve EM underrepresented EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme, and/or institutions from these countries, and/or thematic areas



## **EMDM** profile

#### **One beneficiary**

mobilising a group of other HEIs to set-up a new joint master programme

(mono-beneficiary grant)

Fixed duration of 15 months

#### **EU Grant:**

fixed lump sum contribution of 55.000 Euros

(independent funding scheme from EMJM)

(independent calls for proposals)



## Expected outcomes of an EMDM (1)



#### The jointly designed master should:

- ✓ Offer a fully integrated curriculum delivered by a consortium (involving at least three HEIs from three different countries, of which at least two must be EU Member States or third countries associated to the Programme)
- ✓ Aim at attracting excellent students worldwide
- ✓ Include physical mobility for all recruited students
- ✓ Lead to either a Joint degree or multiple degrees



## Expected outcomes of an EMDM (2)




#### Joint mechanisms to be included in the design of the master programme:

- ✓ Joint programme design and joint procedures
- ✓ Joint administrative and financial management
- ✓ Common services offered to students
- ✓ Joint promotion and dissemination
- ✓ A draft joint Partnership and Student Agreement
- ✓ A joint degree policy and launch of accreditation process
- + explore opportunities offered by the European Approach for Quality Assurance of Joint Programmes (if national legislation allows)



### Taking part as an Organisation



Applications can be submitted by any HEI in an EU Member State, third country associated to the Programme or third country not associated to the Programme

For HEIs in EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: valid ECHE\*


For HEIs in third countries not associated to the programme: ECHE not required but should adhere to its principles

## Key messages - EMDM

- ✓ Positive response to the new EMDM action -> 148 applications
- ✓ Attractive scheme at international level
  - ✓ applications from 40 different countries: 24 from EU Member States and third countries associated to the programme and 16 from other third countries
  - ➤ 41 applications from third countries not associated to the Programme (~ 28%)
  - ➤ Most represented third countries not associated to the programme: Russia, Ukraine, Georgia, Jordan, Morocco
- ✓ Confirmed interest from formerly under-represented EU Member States and third countries associated to the programme [applications from PL (6), LV (4),BG (3), HR (2), RO (2), CY (1), MK (1),Serbia (1) and SK (1)]
